

The Mechanics of Institutional Entropy: A Technical Analysis of Jeff VanderMeer's *Authority*

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The second installment of Jeff VanderMeer's Southern Reach Trilogy, **Authority**, represents a radical departure from the atmospheric, field-expedition narrative of its predecessor, *Annihilation*. While the first book focused on the externalized biological horrors of **Area X**, *Authority* pivots to the internalized, bureaucratic, and psychological decay of the agency tasked with monitoring it: the **Southern Reach**. 6. Mathematical Modeling of Narrative Pacing and Tension
